## Klatovy



Situated near the south-west Czech-German border, the prominent West Bohemian town of Klatovy, known as the "Gate to the Sumava Mountains", is a major administrative centre of the surrounding region. The town, which today has more than 23 thousand inhabitants, is dominated by the famous Black Tower, built between 1547-57, and the twin white towers of the Jesuit church completed in 1679. The town of Klatovy was founded around the year 1260 by King Přemysl Otakar II. near an old market village. It is situated at the crossroads of the former trade routes from Prague to Passau and to Straubing. The square-shaped town square is intersected by a network of streets arranged at right angles. The medieval town was enclosed by two ramparts fortified with both round and four-sided bastions and deep moats. The town flourished during the 16th century when it ranked among the ten richest Czech towns. It was at this time that the prominent feature of Klatovy's skyline, the 81-metre high Black Tower, was built, as well as the neighbouring town hall. In the first half of the 17th century, the town suffered a lot during the Thirty Years' War and the confiscation of property followed the Battle of the White Mountain. The second half of the century saw an increase in construction initiated mainly by the Jesuits of Klatovy. They built the Church of the Immaculate Conception of Virgin Mary (the Jesuit Church) and a monastery for their order; at the same time the Dominican Church of St. Lawrence underwent reconstruction. In the second half of 18th century Klatovy became, for nearly the next one hundred years, the administrative centre of the surrounding region, which also included the neighbouring town of Domažlice. Among the most visited sights in Klatovy is the catacombs in which the Jesuits are buried, and the unique pharmacy "At the White Unicorn", famous for its original Baroque equipment. In addition to its architectural landmarks, Klatovy also takes pride in its exquisite carnations, the cultivation of which dates back to 1813. Tourists are attracted not only to Klatovy's historic town centre, but to the neighbouring countryside as well, where they can visit the castles of Klenová and Švihov. Many people choose to combine their visit to Klatovy with a stay in the nearby Šumava Mountains.
